"The AR Graffiti Wall Gang"

Metamorphose means to change into a different form or type, especially in a way that is abrupt or startling.

'Augmented reality (AR) in the Metaverse involves overlaying visual, auditory, or other sensory information onto the real world to enhance one's experience. Unlike virtual reality, which creates its own cyber environment, augmented reality adds to the existing world as it is.' (https://www.investopedia.com/terms/a/augmented-reality.asp)

The Metaverse is a virtual, three-dimensional space where users interact with each other as avatars, often using virtual reality (VR) or augmented reality (AR) headsets. (META)

Cast of characters (avatars) of the Graffiti Wall Gang and their chosen areas of expertise:

Ruby - minerals for electronic vehicle (EV) batteries
Root - protecting forests
SWAT - computer security
Washtub - water conservation

First, a base video of the City Park where the Graffiti Wall Gang is painted is shot, then the four heroes metamorphose to life from the inner-city graffiti wall through Al-generation + AR. The computerized Graffiti Wall Gang is mixed on the fly for the pending presentation at Franklin Tech. The four avatars will present their messages to the students and faculty gathered there. A production van with computers, cameras and AR support staff jacks into the school's main frame and begins to transcribe the images and soundtrack.

Everyone in the auditorium has an AR headset.

Ruby is first to speak to the room. His car battery-shaped avatar with big eyes, plus images from the City Park and captions, fills the headsets of the assembled:

"Electric vehicle (EV) batteries contain several minerals, including Lithium, Cobalt, Nickel, Manganese, Graphite, Aluminum, and Iron. The United States imports most of the minerals it needs for EV batteries. However, the country does mine some lithium, cobalt, and nickel, and companies are planning to expand production. Recycling products that contain these minerals can also contribute to domestic production."

"Some concerns about critical minerals include:

Availability: A large percentage of critical minerals come from politically unstable countries.

Environmental impact: Mining requires a lot of land, water, and energy.

Social impact: Mining can be a tough, dirty job that requires a lot of resources."

The evolving master AR recording show continues with Root, a tree-like cartoon with a message about forests:

"Forests provide many benefits, including:

- * Providing a suitable habitat for wildlife to live in.
- * Filtering groundwater and preventing runoff to keep water safe for human consumption.
- * Storing carbon.
- * Protecting communities from the worst impacts of climate change.

The next avatar with his computer virus message is SWAT:

"Once it's on your computer or laptop, malware can steal your data, encrypt it so you can't access it, or even erase it completely. For this reason, it's important that you always use antivirus software, and keep it up to date to protect your data and devices."

Last up on the AR avatar build is Washtub. "Here are some examples of water conservation:

- * Collecting rainwater for later use, such as watering plants.
- * Treating wastewater to create a new water supply for non-potable uses, such as irrigation.

- * Using technologies like drip irrigation and micro-sprinklers to deliver water directly to plant roots.
- * Using shower heads, faucets, and toilets that are designed to use less water.
- * Treating and reusing wastewater for non-potable purposes.

Here are some tips for conserving water at home:

- * Fix leaks.
- * Take shorter showers.
- * Turn off the water when brushing your teeth or shaving.
- * Only run the washing machine and dishwasher when they are full.
- * Use a low-flow shower head and faucet aerators."

The four avatar characters take a bow. Then the headsets go dark. A copy of the finished AR-driven .mov is given to Franklin Tech for their AR Library.

Jason is a single player at the Senior Ball this year. Maybe Suzie Marks will also come without a date, too. He notices that the AR computer gear is interfaced with the sound system on the high school gym stage. The DJ is warm. The crowd already has their META WIFI-supported headsets on. Everything is on the fly.

Using their yearbook for base images, student head shots were filmed earlier for avatars created by the AR Producers for each of the 74 graduates. The walls and ceiling are plastered with large colored balloons. An interesting topography for an augmented reality production. The Senior's avatars are kind a like the Ghosts in "Ghostbusters" - cartoon-like.

Jason looks distorted with his tuxedo and headset. Now text comes scrolling across the big screen over the stage:

"Students please dance with each other's avatars." Jason sends brain signals to his headset and selects Jamie Ryan's avatar. His 4-minute dance with her avatar is choreographed by the Producers driven by their computers in the AR truck in the parking lot.

Finally, dance #2: the avatars dance amongst themselves. Free form. Swing. The balloons are distorting the avatar's appearance in the headsets. Seniors can watch the new AR .mov in the computer lab!

"The Alley"

The Fossil


The burn extends across the outer ridge and down into a ghost town. All that is revealed are the footsteps left by the firemen in a cratered Moon-like yellow white ash.
