

Permaculture Zones and the UC Boulder AI + AR Lab

Mav and Susan are exploring a permaculture zone design for an AI + AR experiment at the University of Colorado Boulder AR Lab. They use the football field to shoot the base video. The football field lines become a grid to help lay-out the 2-step production. Lights are on the field, no lights in the stands. Focus is on the hash lines or grid on the field.

Susan heats up: "Augmented reality (AR) involves overlaying visual, auditory, or other sensory information onto the real world to enhance one's experience. Unlike virtual reality, which creates its own cyber environment, augmented reality adds to the existing world as it is."

The creators and crew walk through the grid iron set and discuss the permaculture village design based on zones. Zones are a way to understand land-use design and synergies. Primary uses (tiny houses) are Zone 0 then the other features fan-out in Zones 1 (pond) and Zone 4 (vegetable garden):

pond (Zone 1)
spiral flower garden (Zone 2)
tool shed (Zone 3)
vegetable garden (Zone 4)
compost bins (Zone 5)
bee hives (Zone 6)
```

The bee hives are in Zone 6. Zones help to create" permaculture prompts", and support AI-generated permaculture elements for the second, computer generated segment that will be combined with the base video.

As the football field disappears, replaced with tall grasses and permaculture features, Mav and Susan's avatars walk through the virtual village, visiting each computer-generated element in the "local zoned" Metaverse.

The final movie with the base video plus Al-generated scenes creates augmented reality. The two students are onto something big; this isn't their father's agriculture.

The Resilient Communities Project (RCP) Website is Live

A RCP defines a Resilient Community as one that:

- nurtures the healing and well-being of members and the wider community
- rejuvenates ecosystems while building soil and benefiting the climate
- provides simple, affordable, low impact housing
- regeneratively produces much or most of its own food and other necessities

A Resilient Community features:

- A Resilient Community Land Trust establishes a permanent commons as a basis for living sustainably on the land within a regenerative economic system. If members are part of the initial core team they can help develop a binding land-use charter that will define how the land is to be fairly allocated and stewarded for regenerative purposes. Members can also help elect or even possibly serve on the board.
- A Resilient Community Housing Co-op will typically be composed of clustered housing that meets zoning rules while providing desired privacy. The housing co-op's membership bylaws are crafted to help prevent, manage, or resolve interpersonal problems or conflicts through initial vetting, communication training, mediation, etc. As part of an initial core team members can help develop the bylaws specifying community rules and member selection policies.

The only feasible way to achieve a livable future for all is for the industrialized world to steadily reduce its energy use to well below current levels. This will require permaculture and regenerative agriculture practices, as well as appropriate technologies to enable a simplified way of life. Most of us will sooner or later have to move back to and live off the land. Fortunately, rural life is ultimately healthier and happier than city life and that is where most of us will end up anyway. Some have already made the move; more and more of us need to.

The Resilient Community Land Trust

The Resilient Community Land Trust (RCLT) is a model for communities to control land and development.

The RCLT is a nonprofit organization governed by a board of Resilient Community Project (RCP) residents, community citizens and public representatives that provides lasting community assets and shared equity homeownership opportunities for families and communities. The RCLT supports rural and urban agriculture projects, commercial spaces to serve local communities, affordable rental and cooperative housing projects, and conserves land or urban green spaces. However, the heart of the Trust is the creation of homes that remain permanently affordable, providing successful homeownership opportunities for generations of lower income families.

Members of the Trust receive qualified permanent control over a specific housing unit and/or portion of the land subject to housing co-op rules and RCLT conditions. If they later wish to leave, they can sell their equity share to people vetted according to co-op and RCLT policies. The Resilient Community Land Trust establishes a permanent commons as a basis for living sustainably on the land within a regenerative economic system.

If through fair procedures anyone's membership is terminated for serious violations of the housing coop bylaws or the RCLT, their equity would be returned minus any mediation, arbitration, or other properly deductible costs. If members' savings are kept in a community fund, they could invest their collective capital in developing community and financing community enterprises. With provisions for ongoing funding, long-term care in old age or disability could be included in the RCLT and/or housing co-op bylaws.

Question One: Do we first need a cohesive kindred group of people or does acquiring land come first? Is this a parallel process?

Question Two: What are some ways to acquire land where land trust members may start a resilient community? Some possibilities to start with are:

- * An existing landholder is bought out over time into a land trust.
- * Someone buys the land and is bought out over time into a land trust.
- * A group of people buy the land and are bought out over time into a land trust.
- * A person, organization, or government donates land to a land trust.
- * Funds are raised through a non-profit to buy the land for a land trust.
- * Seller financing by existing land owner is used to buy the land.
- * Land is leased with an option to buy.
- * A lease-to-own contract is created.
- * A fiscal partnership with a non-profit is created to buy land.
- * Grant money is obtained for land.
- * Land is willed to a land trust.
- * Win the lottery and buy some land.

* Any combination of the above.
